It is a pleasure and a privilege to welcome you to our first Pix Brook News. All in the Bedfordshire Schools Trust (BEST) community are thrilled to open this new state-of-the-art school for the pupils of Central Bedfordshire.

The Pix Brook Academy (PBA) will welcome its first cohort of pupils on 1 September 2019. The school will be a mixed-sex, 9-16 extended-Secondary school, serving 1260 pupils. The admission number for each year group will be 180. As a new school, PBA pupils will benefit from an exceptional learning environment, enriched by the latest technologies, all in a beautiful rural setting.

The purpose of the Pix Brook News is to keep you fully up-to-date with progress as we move towards the opening of PBA. As you will learn from the pages that follow, much has already been achieved. Our vision and values are in place; our founding Principal and Chair of Governors have been appointed; our site has been chosen and works are underway; and, our education plan is ready to go.

Initially, in September 2019 PBA will open on the current

Etonbury Academy site, with a first cohort of 120 pupils. The new building will be available in September 2020. A full programme of communications beyond this newsletter, including open evenings, parent/community forums, a new website and social media alerts are in place. There is a clear and transparent timeline for all activities, referencing website links/computer generated images of what the buildings will look like. It is going to be fabulous.

Whilst the purpose of this newsletter is to keep you informed, it is also an invitation to 'get involved'. Indeed, it has been wonderful to see so many of you at the two Open Evenings we have already held. Of course, PBA will have many advantages and benefit from the immense expertise and experience contained within BEST. #### MEET THE PRINCIPAL

I would like to take this opportunity to provide a brief introduction before I take up the exciting opportunity as Principal of Pix Brook Academy.

For the last thirteen years I have been working in Leighton Buzzard as the Deputy Head Teacher of Vandyke Upper School and subsequently as Head Teacher of Gilbert Inglefield Middle School. I have worked in schools as a teacher for over twenty years having started my career in London teaching economics and maths. #### **Admissions**

A reminder that all Transfer to Middle 2019 applications must be received by the School Admissions Team by 15 January 2019. If you are applying for a place at Pix Brook Academy you will need to complete the Middle 2019 application as well as the Pix Brook application.

The School Admissions Team will be sending reminder letters in the first few days of January to those families yet to make their application to encourage them to apply by the closing date.

All families who apply by the closing date (15 January) will be notified of the outcome of their application on 16 April 2019. The School Admissions Team will contact Pix Brook applicants once the funding agreement with the Department for Education has been signed to merge their applications ahead of the allocation.
