Safeguarding

This is just a polite request for any parent/carer to have a conversation and/or audit of their child's mobile phone and social media use. As a school we are unable to monitor if or how any of our pupils are using social media when they are not in school. It continues to be brought to our attention that some pupils are using apps which may not be appropriate or relevant for them. Could we therefore ask that, if your child is using any apps, you have a conversation about safe and appropriate use of these apps, check things such as privacy settings and which apps your child is currently using. Although we fully appreciate the huge advantages and excitement social media can have, we also need to be mindful that some children may not have the skills, knowledge or understanding yet to use such platforms safely, wisely and correctly. Could we also please ask that parents/ carers speak to their child to remind them that if they have any worries about a friend, that they should always speak to a member of staff or yourselves and to avoid (whenever possible) discussing it with their peers. Discussing worries with friends (although useful in some circumstances) can sometimes lead to gossip, misunder-standings and further upset. Your support in this matter would be greatly appreciated.

We would like to thank the parents/carers that take it upon themselves to contact the safeguarding team to raise any worries/issues that they may have. Please do feel free to continue to do so as safeguarding should be seen as the responsibility of everyone.
