## Safeguarding at Pix Brook Academy

Although all adults working at Pix Brook Academy have a responsibility for child protection and safeguarding, there are three staff with particular responsibility for safeguarding. These are:

All staff have received safeguarding training at the start of the academic year which included recent updates from the Keeping Children Safe in Education (Part 1) guidance. This will ensure they are competent in helping safeguard our pupils and are aware of the issues around safeguarding.

All pupils should feel comfortable speaking about anything that is worrying or upsetting them when they are in school and understand that all adults at school are there to keep them safe. We would therefore encourage all parents to regularly remind their son/daughter that they can speak to any member of staff at school if something is causing them worry. They should also be reminded that there are also three members of staff that have a special responsibility for ensuring their safety.

We will be working with our pupils to make them aware of what safeguarding means, who they can turn to when something is worrying them and the role of our safeguarding team.
