Nightingale class, was the place to be on a Tuesday lunchtime for Pokémon club. This will be running again next year.






Teaching & Learning News

Geography

This time of year we like to reflect on the progress the students that have made since the beginning of the year. Year 5 have had some great learning experiences with some exciting topics including Rainforest, communities and UK geography. Seeing their final pieces of work shows not only their progress they have made but also the pride the children have in the work they produce. Year 6 have had the challenge of developing their geographic knowledge as well as new vocabulary particularly when learning about glaciers. They then used their new vocabulary to produce fact-files of how glaciers have shaped landscapes using the lake district as a case study. Our first year of KS3 geography has created some challenging but also exciting learning experiences. Year 7 have developed knowledge in not only geographic locations but they have also had opportunities to create political debates about the future of the environment, including a creating a court case of who is responsible for deforestation of the Amazon rainforest. The students were given the chance to speak directly to our local MP Richard Fuller about the future of Stotfold and how to develop the town in a sustainable fashion. At the end of another busy and exciting year reflecting on the amazing progress the children have made feeds into planning of even more exciting learning experiences in the next academic year.

Eco council

This term saw the set-up of the eco council, the children who became councillors are very enthusiastic about creating positive environmental changes in our school, it is great to see the children embrace their social responsibility to the school community. Our first target is for the council to work toward the eco schools green flag award, to achieve this the councillors will work on projects to help our school community become more eco aware as well as creating actions within the school to reduce our impact on the environment. To help facilitate this I have had a range of meetings with the local council and the tiny forest foundation who will be giving some funds for the eco council to add some additional plants on the school site. In the new academic year, we will be using the eco pod for the council meetings, I am looking forward to seeing the impact that the eco council will make in our community.



Citizenship

This subject helps children develop knowledge and skills to be responsible citizens this subject helps students explore society and what impacts it. Year 5 have learnt about their community, environment and personal safety. The topic the Year 5 children particularly enjoyed was carrying out their antibullying campaigns in the spring term, the children came up with some fantastic campaigns some included songs, raps and posters. Year 6 started the year learning about the human rights act comparing the rights of children in the UK to the rights of children in other countries, the Year 6 students also had topics about British values and healthy living.



Year 7's were given the opportunity to join the British Youth Parliament, which enabled them to experience democracy and British values first hand. Students who were voted onto the youth parliament have since experienced international events such as pride week and assisted in the creation and development of the Eco Council and campaigned for issues such as the environment and homelessness. Special thanks must go to the year 7 students Year 7 citizenship started with parliamentary democracy which included a trip to parliament where the children toured both the house of commons and the house of lords. They also enjoyed learning about careers and personal qualities to support in their future careers, in this topic the students got to carry out an enterprise project. The project helped foster team work and practice their leadership skills. Each student got to experience being the leader of a task then reflect on their experience of leading their team. In the next academic year, we are looking forward to creating more opportunities in citizenship to help students develop the skills to become socially responsible citizens of the future.



French

Year 5 and 6 have been learning about food, currency, preferences and questions this term.

This culminated in a WOW lesson where students went shopping using Euros to buy food in French.

They took on the roles of shop keepers or buyers using language in French like "What would you like?" "How much is it?" "I would like....."

They didn't brilliantly and really enjoyed working in teams to bring this task together. It was such a pleasure to watch them and to see how much they have progressed this year in French. Well done Year 5 and Year 6!

MOBILE PHONES


